Draft conclusions

Agenda

- 1. The Committee agreed to include a new item in the agenda related to the contribution of the SCCR to the implementation of the respective Development Agenda recommendations. Some delegations stated that the inclusion of this item was temporary only at this session of the Committee preceding the General Assembly and should not set a precedent.
- The Committee agreed to continue to work on all subjects on the agenda of the 24th session of the SCCR taking into account their equal importance and different levels of maturity.
- 3. The Committee recognized both existing priorities and the right of every Member to submit new items or proposals for consideration. Accordingly, the timelines reflected in these conclusions are without prejudice to new items or proposals to be submitted for the work plan of 2013 2014 by any Members, subject to the adoption of such proposals by the Committee.
- 4. In future the WIPO Secretariat will prepare an annotated agenda reflecting the date on

- 4. The Committee agreed to recommend to the WIPO General Assembly that the SCCR continue discussion to work towards an appropriate international legal instrument or instruments (whether model law, joint recommendation, treaty and/or other forms), with the target to submit recommendations by the SCCR/30 session to the General Assembly on Limitations and Exceptions for Educational, Teaching and Research Institutions and Persons with other Disabilities.

Intervention by ENCES: European Network for Copyright in Support of Education and Science

Thank you, Mr. Chairman (Madame Chair), for the opportunity to make an intervention to the





- 1. Access to and use of commercially published works, without further authorization, for
 - a) personal use in scholarly environment
 - b) personal use in non-commercial institutions in education
 - c) non-commercial communication and intermediary services of culture and memory institutions such as libraries, archives, documentation and media centers, and museums
- 2. Making these works publicly available for well defined user groups in science and education
- 3. Free use (without authorization and without remuneration) for documentation, preservation, and long-term archiving purposes of non-commercial culture and memory institutions
- 4. Flat remuneration only and provided by public state-owned science and education institutions.



Proposed regulation for the use of published work in science and education

- 1) Copying, distributing and making published works available to the public is, without further authorization, permitted for personal and restriction-free use in science and for educational purposes in schools, institutions of higher education (such as universities), and other non-commercial institutions dedicated to education, continuing and professional training. The right to make works publicly available (and to use these works) is restricted in each case to a well-defined group of people in science and education. Sentence 1 is valid for scientific and educational purposes in documentation, archiving and preservation. Sentence 1 is valid for services provided by publicly financed libraries, archives, documentation centers and museums which support scientific usage and serve educational purposes.
- (2) The usage of published works according to sentence 1, 2, 4 of para (1) may be subject to remuneration provided it does not affect the normal development of education and research activities.
- (3) Contractual agreements which rule out para (1) are invalid.



SCCR Conclusions

Limitations and exceptions for educational and research institutions and persons with other disabilities

- 1. The Committee **took note** of the "Provisional working document towards an appropriate International Legal Instrument (in whatever form) on Limitations and Exceptions for Educational, Teaching and Research Institutions and Persons with Other Disabilities Containing Comments and Textual Suggestions" (document SCCR/24/8 Prov.).
- 2. The Committee agreed to continue text-based work on SCCR/24/8/Prov. at the SCCR/26 session, towards an appropriate international legal instrument or instruments (whether model law, joint recommendation, treaty and/or other forms), and to consider during that meeting the possible reorganization of the document and the possible identification of issues on which the Committee could focus its text-based work, with the target to submit recommendations on limitations and exceptions for educational, teaching and research institutions and persons with other disabilities to the General Assembly by the SCCR/30 session.
- 3. The Committee **took note** of the request of the African Group and its Member States, and of the Delegations of Argentina, Brazil, and Ecuador, that their comments in document SCCR/24/8/Prov. be moved to an annex at the end of the document.

Next session of the SCCR

4. The 26th session of the SCCR will take place in July 2013. The Committee agreed that two days will be devoted to the agenda item on the protection of broadcasting organizations; two days will be devoted to the agenda item on limitations and exceptions for libraries and archives; and one day will be devoted to the agenda item on limitations and exceptions for educational, teaching and research institutions and persons with other disabilities.
